  - i. that the applicant is not eligible to obtain a licence by virtue of s36 or s37.
  - ii. if the applicant is a company, that any person who will be an officer of the company if the application is granted is not, by reason of his or her personal character or financial position, a proper person to be an officer of a licensee company.
